



Making a date with the Moveable Feast

Now in its 16 year, the Norwich Moveable Feast got underway on Tuesday night, sponsored for the fifth consecutive year by Cozens-Hardy LLP Solicitors.

The much-loved event which this year saw more than 1000 tickets sold and 20 restaurant take part, allowed diners to sample the delights from three different city restaurants all in one night; so you have a starter in one venue, the main in another and the dessert in a third restaurant.

The event was founded by former Norfolk councillor and restaurateur, the late Lloyd Addison in 1999 and money raised from the feast is donated to charities helping people affected by Parkinsons disease. It's here to stay...as I drift into a forced retirement due to my medical condition, the name of Lloyd Addison will never be far away from the pages of the EDP."
