



WINNING RESTAURANT SUCCESSFULLY DEFENDS TITLE!

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Organisers of Lloyd Addison's Moveable Feast supported by Cozens-Hardy solicitors have revealed this year's winner.

In a new twist this year, guests were invited to score the starter, the main and the dessert and the results were then added together to create the overall score, revealing that last year's winner, Brasted's, have defended their title. The much-loved Framingham Pigot establishment always create a pop-up city centre restaurant, returning to their roots as a business which was originally founded in the centre of Norwich, and this year they teamed up with the St John the Baptist cathedral to create a restaurant in their Narthex. Following closely on their heels in second and third place were The Assembly House and Munro's at The Lawyer.

The hugely popular and much-anticipated evening, which is one of the highlights of the Norfolk Food & Drink calendar, took place on Tuesday 22nd September and once again saw over 1000 guests enjoy a trail around the city as they experienced their starter, main and dessert in different restaurants.

Nick Mills, Managing Director of Brasted's said:

"We are obviously delighted that our food on the night was so well received. Part of what Brasted's does is outside catering and we are used to creating workable kitchens in the most unusual of venues, but I have to say, we had never transformed part of a cathedral into a restaurant before, so that was really great fun! We are so glad that our guests entered into the spirit of the evening with such warmth and enthusiasm."

Founded in 1999 by Norwich restaurateur and former County Councillor, Lloyd Addison, the Moveable Feast sees many restaurants sign up year after year to participate, including Lam Thai, The Iron House, The Wine Cellar, Madermarket Kitchen, The Dining Rooms, Bedford's, The Library, The Assembly House, Roots, Brasted's, Prime, Spice lounge, St Giles House, The Maids Head and The Lawyer. This year also saw the addition of two other pop-up restaurants – at The Norfolk Club,



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where 2014 Norfolk Chef of The Year Danny Smith and his team created a mouth-watering menu, and The Great Hospital which saw the City College Norwich team up with the kitchen brigade from the hospital. Completing the line-up this year was The Georgian Town House and East 26.

As well as the sumptuous food and fun as diners find their way around Norwich in search for their dinner, the evening is also an important event for fundraising for Parkinson's UK and this year the committee are delighted to announce that a staggering £18,635.84 was raised for the charity, which is a record for this event. Founder Lloyd Addison's widow, Cynthia, who is an integral part of the organising committee said:

"We are thrilled to have once again raised so much for the charity and our sincere thanks go to all the incredible Parkinson's UK volunteers, who do such a wonderful job of ensuring that the guests have a great experience on the night, as well as to all those on the committee who help to put the event together and of course, the restaurants who make the whole evening possible.
